Principals Report

Kelly provided the following update:

Our field is back open and available though we do have a schedule currently set up for during lunch. The monitors are finding they like it, and it is working. They do say that some grade 5 students are still complaining. The schedule is not set in stone; we are collecting data on its use and are keeping track of incidents on the field.

- ❖ Planning for next year has begun and our allocation is showing that we tentatively have 16 classrooms from P-5 and one Pre-Primary classroom. We will have some staff turnover for next year as some term staff and redundant staff will not be returning and some permanent staff have posted out. Our enrollment is currently set for next year is approximately 366 students.
- PTC hosted their Spring Bingo in May, and it was a success. Our game callers did a great job. The event raised approximately \$4500 minus expenses.
- Lynn had her additional VTRA training (Violence Threat Risk Assessment- Level 2) at the end of April and Kelly is currently in the middle of her training days.
- Our Professional Development Day on April 30th was on the Safe Schools Strategy; school safety/the provincial code of conduct. The afternoon was on student success planning which we will talk more about later in the meeting.
- ❖ The students recognized Black Excellence Day on the 15th and teachers were encouraged to have some meaningful conversations around that. Teachers were provided a google slide presentation to support these discussions, one of which is helping students recognize the difference between black excellence and fame.

- ❖ Our grade three students are currently in the middle of writing the grade 3 provincial literacy math assessment. The literacy portion was completed last Tuesday (15th) and Wednesday (16th) with the math portion being written Wednesday (21st) and Thursday 22nd) of this week.
- ❖ The Arts Specialists will be in for the month of June to do some projects/workshops with the students. One of which is learning how to tie dye and its cultural significance/history, and another may be an outdoor project and/or bringing a new school mascot to life (more details to come regarding the mascot).
- Other events coming up... an in-school only talent show, field day, in school drama production for some grades (TBD), plus the grade 5 bowling trip and closing.
- ❖ Staffing issues: Ms. Worthylake has finished in the grade 2 as she is a retired teacher and was running out of available days since Ms. Christie will not be returning for this school year. Mrs. Frazee who is returning from her maternity leave will take over in that class while Ms. Nickel will remain in what would have been Mrs. Frazee's class. Ms. Lee will be returning in early June to her class which is currently being taught by Mrs. Walsh.

❖ Though our SSP has been primarily focused on **professional practice** and using **qualitative data** to confirm our observations, identify strengths and next steps of instruction, we are happy to report that from January to now, we have seen some students who were previously not meeting have

closed the gap. In January, in P-2 we had 4 students of Indigenous Ancestry not meeting to only 1 currently and we had 1 student of African and Indigenous Ancestry not meeting and they are now. For all other, it went from 37-32 students. At the grade 3-5 level, the numbers didn't change but the degree in which they were not meeting has decreased, and they are making gains in other aspects of reading (six pillars of reading).

We also are going to purchase and outdoor mud kitchen and Timber Boards for building which include a carry case.

Financial Report

- We used approximately \$600 of the \$800 spoken about at the last meeting on professional resources as some are still on back order.
- We also purchased chapters books that correspond to grade 4 reading levels \$779.28 from Tattletales. Sets of 4 were purchased to allow for small group work.
- The purchase of the Fountas and Pinnell kit for 3-5 has been put on hold as there may be some changes to what the system wants us to use as part of a balanced literacy approach.
